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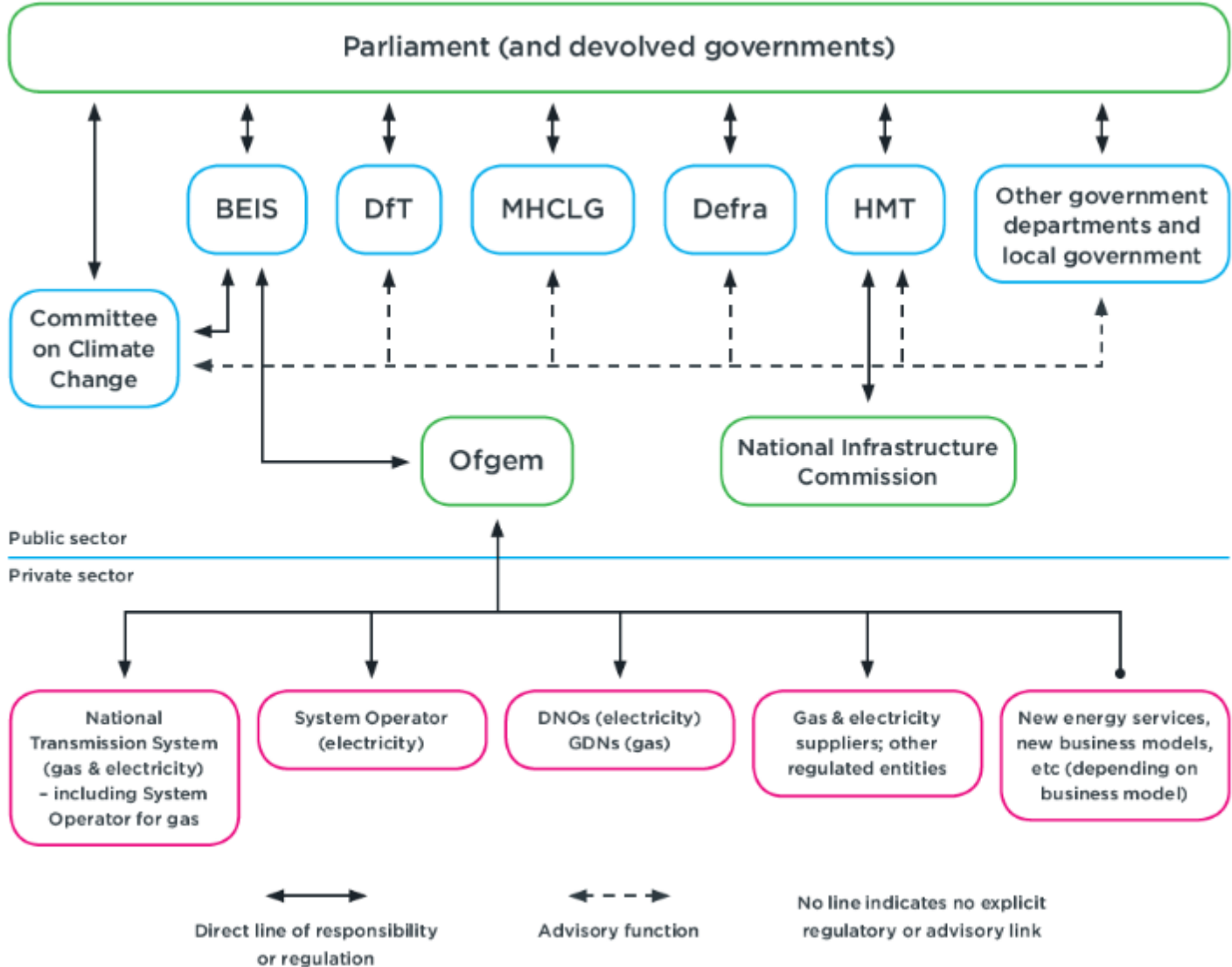

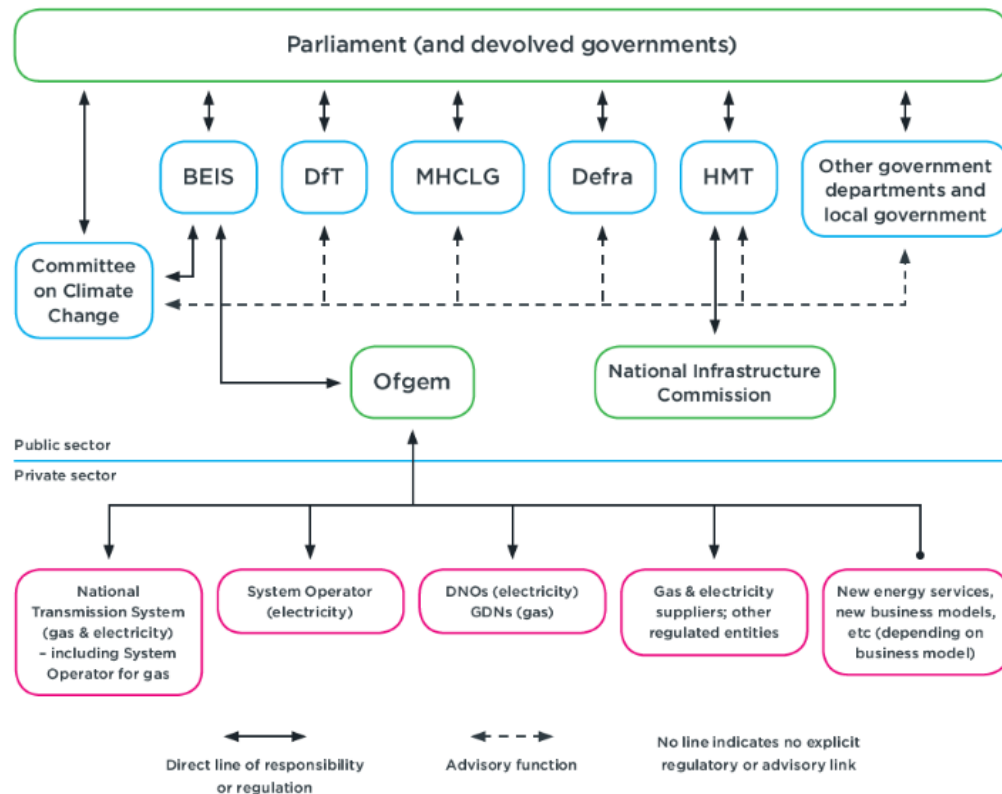

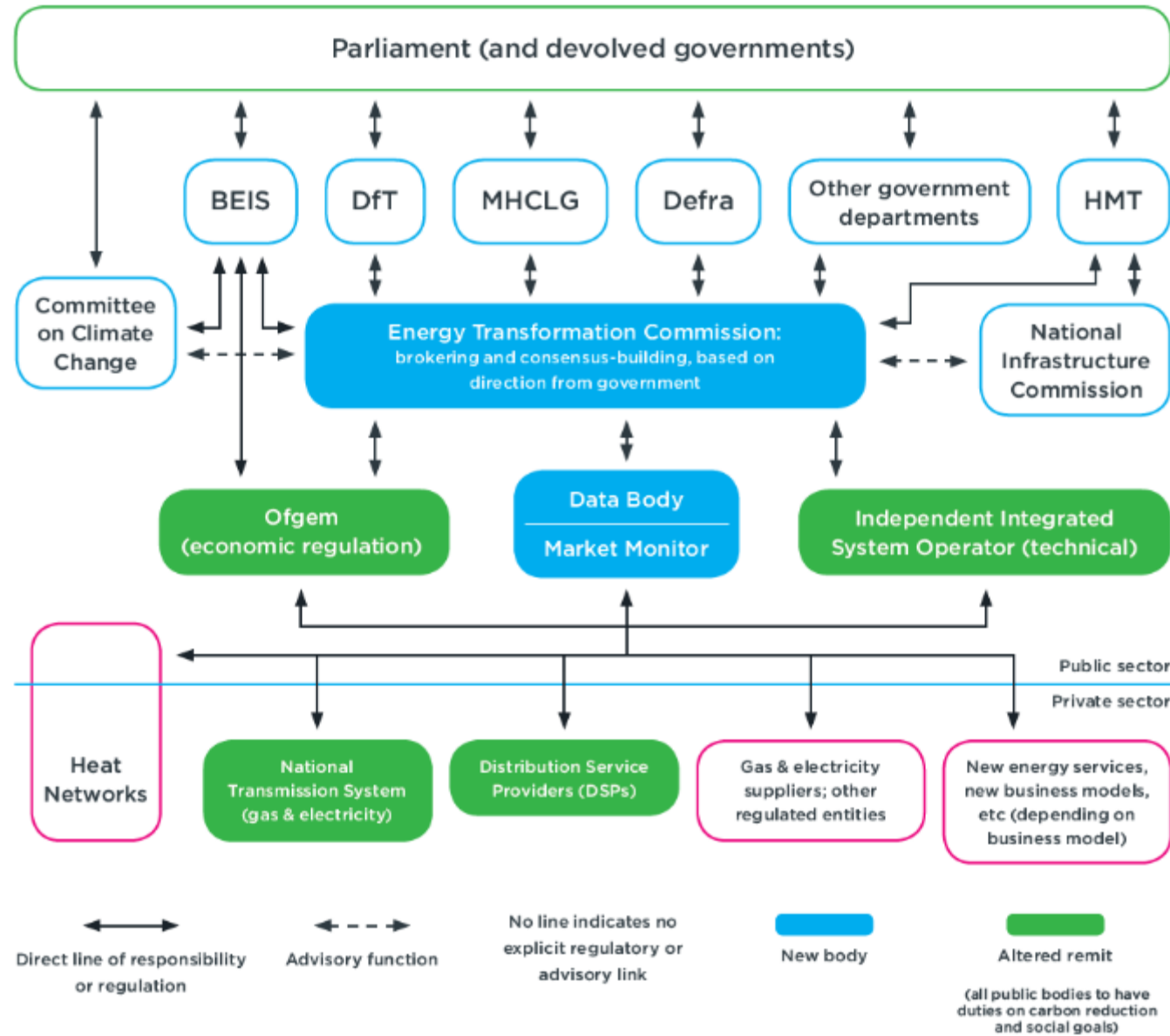
GB energy governance: current institutions and responsibilities

- Social outcomes?

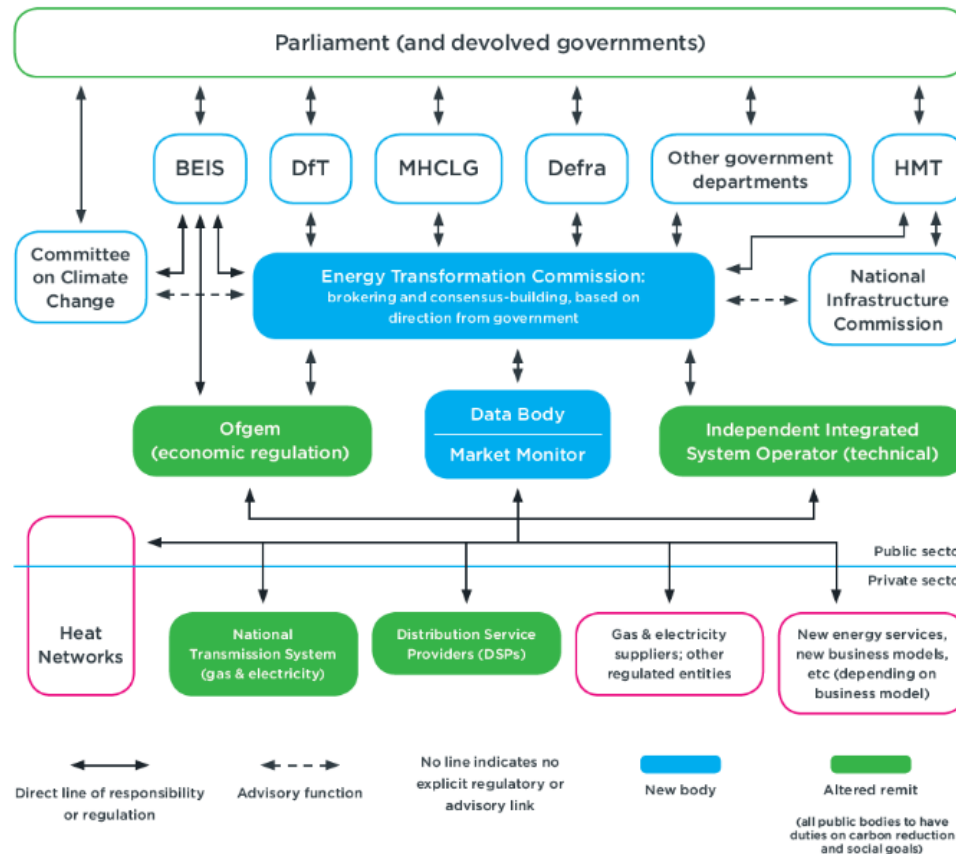

- Govt sets strategic direction
- ETC co-ordinates and implements
- CCC & NIC continue in current form
- ETC engages – wide group of stakeholders
- Deep dives – eg EVs, heat decarb
- Ofgem is economic regulator
- IISO is a technical body

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
